Charitable Care and Coverage

We believe that everyone has a right to good health.



- 23,549 children served in the Medicaid program
- 17,400 people supported with medical financial assistance
- 2,470 people covered in the Bridge Program, Kaiser Permanente's Charitable Health Coverage program

Delivering Access to Care

We partner with organizations to bring free health screenings and resources directly to uninsured and underinsured adults in the community through our Mobile Health Vehicle.



- Held 85 community events
- Partnered with 45 organizations
- Provided 1,410 health screenings, including flu shots



Thriving Schools

We are committed to creating communities where people can be healthy in all places they live, work, learn and play.



- Resiliency in School Environment (RISE) initiative empowers educators to create safe and supportive learning environment by implementing policies and practices that improve the social-emotional health of both students and staff.
 - Recruited 31 schools from three school districts (DeKalb, Douglas and Fulton) to participate in the RISE initiative
 - Our Educational Theatre Program provided 20 metro Atlanta schools with the RISE UP workshop, which provides skills and ideas to school staff on using a trauma sensitive approach with interactions with students
 - Over 1,600 teachers, administrators and school staff were reached with the RISE UP workshop



Educational Theatre Program

Children and families learn about health in whole new way.

- 813 performances offered free of charge to schools, corporations, nonprofits and community groups
- Visited 114 schools in metro Atlanta
- 211,974 youth and adults saw/participated in an Educational Theatre Performance



Thriving Cities

We collaborate with municipal leaders and policymakers to support cities to develop and implement a broad array of policies that promote positive health outcomes among their residents.

- CityHealth, a national partner, works with us to advance policy adoption in large cities in Kaiser Permanente markets across the country.
 - City of Atlanta achieved an overall silver medal with five or more gold- and silver-rated policies in categories such as:
 - High-quality universal pre-K
 - Clean indoor air
 - Smoke-free indoor air
 - Food safety and restaurant inspection rating
 - Supported City of Atlanta's new smoke-free policy
